ABOUT THE AREA

The Tunnel Gully Recreation Area is managed by the Greater Wellington Regional Council. It is a good example of lowland native forest and the main tracks are very good. In orienteering terms the forest has been classified optimistically; even the light green areas are quite slow and the medium green is a struggle or has not been mapped. 10m contours miss a lot of ground detail.
